# WHO ARE THE DSC 100?

The term "DSC 100" stands for "giving 100%." Anyone can be part of the DSC 100 and if you are a member of this dedicated team of volunteers, you know the meaning of teamwork.

The DSC 100 are members, along with family, friends and co-workers, who volunteer their talent, time and energy working at our office, at our events, during our Annual Convention and in many other tasks that help make DSC a success!

Each year, over 500 volunteers come together to create "The Greatest Huntering Convention on the Planet!"

# **BENEFITS OF BEING A DSC 100 VOLUNTEER**

- Invitation to the annual volunteer recognition party

- Personally meet and assist the DSC Exhibitor Partners during convention



# **SECURITY**

Volunteers are goodwill ambassadors. We interface with Exhibitor Partners and monitor all Convention hall entrances during move-in and move-out to verify credentials. Some committee members will patrol parking lots during Convention hours. This committee works closely with facility security and local police. Shifts may range from three to six hours.

#### **SILENT AUCTION**

Volunteers set up tables in the Silent Auction area and display the items prior to opening day. We meet, greet and register anyone wishing to bid, answer questions and direct bidders to the booths of item donors. After the auction closes, money is collected from the winners and their merchandise transferred to them whenever possible. We also clean up and straighten the area at the end of each day. Shifts are generally two hours, once per day.

# **SPECIAL EVENTS**

Throughout the year DSC and the DSC Foundation host a variety of events where the help of our volunteers is essential. These include the big bore shoot, clay shoot, member events, the DSC Foundation Gala, and more.

#### TRAFFIC

Our volunteers manage the flow of exhibitor vehicles into and out of the exhibitor secure lot during move-in and move-out. The main function of this committee is to organize and stage cars, trucks and trailers containing exhibitor booth contents prior to releasing them to the loading docks at the convention center. Volunteers also direct Exhibitor Partners on efficiently parking their trailers and vehicles to maximize space in the secure lot.

The move-in process start and end times will vary based on location, but typically occur the day or two before Convention and conclude with move-out on the closing day of the show. Volunteers are encouraged to work approximately six hour shifts. For move-out, volunteers begin working shifts in the morning to maintain integrity of the lot and to organize exhibitor vehicles prior to start the move-out process.


Some traffic volunteers also work on the day before move-in to place cones and barricades in the secure lot as well as to place directional signage on local streets to assist exhibitors in navigation to and from the convention center.

There are a number of different jobs performed by members of this committee including greeters, lane managers, release point managers and trailer parking assistants.

# **AUCTION ITEM TRANSPORT**

Volunteers collect all auction items for the evening banquets and silent auction and transport them to and from the banquet halls and the Convention Center. With this committee, you will attend the evening banquets, meet great Exhibitor Partners and interact with the winning bidders of the items.

#### CONCIERGE

Volunteers will set up and staff Concierge Booths to assist Convention attendees. We provide info on nearby restaurants, area attractions, service providers, physicians, etc. This is a fun and exciting opportunity for energetic folks who are familiar with our Convention and/or know our city and its attractions well.

#### DSC STORE

Volunteers sell DSC logo items to attendees, Exhibitor Partners and members. No cash register experience is necessary – we just need goodwill ambassadors!

#### **EXHIBITOR BREAKFAST GREETER**

This committee welcomes guests each morning for the exhibitor breakfast hosted by DSC for our Exhibitor Partners. A typical shift goes from 7 to 9 am on show open dates.

# **EXHIBITOR REGISTRATION**

Assist with check in and on-site registration for our Exhibitor Partners. Registration opens on the first move-in day and runs through the conclusion of move-in. You become well acquainted with the Exhibitor Partners and can make good, lasting friendships. Volunteers will need to devote a half or full day per shift.

# **EXHIBITOR WELCOME**

We need a large number of volunteers on this team to welcome all of our incredible Exhibitor Partners. The time commitment for this role is 1-2 hours and the best time is early on the first or second Convention days, or even at the end of move-in. You will have a list of Exhibitor Partners, all in the same area, to greet, introduce yourself, welcome them and thank them for their support.

#### **HOSPITALITY - COFFEE CARTS**

Cruise the aisles with a coffee cart offering refreshments to exhibitor partners and volunteers. Shifts begin about one hour before Convention opens each day. Exhibitors love to see the carts!

#### LADIES' LUNCHEON

Volunteers plan and organize all aspects of the annual Ladies' Luncheon. Subcommittees help with the live and silent auctions, raffles, door prizes, favors, table decorations, invitations, donations and sponsorships. This team gets the work done in short concise meetings leading up to the grand event. This show-stopping event includes great cuisine and wine, an inspiring keynote speaker and incomparable camaraderie. If you can relate, then certainly the Ladies' Luncheon committee is for you!

### LIFE MEMBER/MEMBER BREAKFAST

Volunteers assist with set-up early in the morning in preparation for these very special annual events. These breakfasts consist of special guest speakers, silent and live auctions, delightful meal options, a mimosa bar, door prizes and more.

#### **MEMBERSHIP BOOTH**

Volunteers help recruit and sign up new members. This is a fun way to share your enthusiasm about DSC and to bring new members into the organization. Shifts run on show days and are typically 3 hours.

# **MOVE-IN / MOVE-OUT (MIMO)**

The Move-In process goes all day on the two days prior to opening day. Move-Out begins promptly at show close on the last day of the show, and is typically finished by later that evening. As a MIMO volunteer, you will help our Exhibitors unload their trucks and trailers and help them move their exhibit materials to their booth location. We do not assist in building booths. There is very little heavy lifting – this is a job that most anyone can do. On the day of show close, we help the Exhibitor Partners pack up. We have a great group of volunteers and have lots of fun. MIMO is the largest Convention committee and we need all the help we can get.

#### **RAFFLES**

Raffles are a fun and exciting area of the Convention floor! The Raffles area is open during Convention hours with the final drawing happening just before show close. Volunteers will need to devote one or more three hour shifts. Duties include assisting raffle ladies with ticket sales and some data entry. Volunteers should be familiar with current raffle items to help assist prospective buyers.
